

More Casualties Feared as Apartment Block Collapses in Central Russia

At least two people have died after a Soviet-era apartment building partially collapsed in the central Russian city of Izhevsk.

Emergency services believe a gas explosion may have caused the part of the nine-story building to <u>fall</u>, according to the news website Udmurt.media.

A source in the emergency services <u>told</u> the Interfax news agency that two bodies were recovered from the rubble and that two survivors had been hospitalized.

Social media users **reported** hearing screams from beneath the rubble.

The regional branch of Russia's Emergency Situations Ministry confirmed a childcare center on the first floor of the building was not impacted by the explosion, the state-run TASS news agency <u>reported</u>.

Footage captured immediately after the collapse shows dust coming from the building.
