

Russian Athlete Claims First Gold in Pyeongchang Amid Doping Controversy

Athletes from Russia competing under a neutral flag won the country's first gold medal at the Winter Olympics when 15-year old figure skater Alina Zagitova claimed gold <u>Friday</u> morning.

The win follows <u>controversy</u> surrounding Alexander Krushelnitsky, who was stripped of his bronze medal in mixed doubles curling on Thursday after testing positive for meldonium.

The women's figure-skating silver went to another Russian, Yevgenia Medvedeva, with bronze claimed by Kaetlyn Osmond from Canada.

This brings the total number of <u>medals</u> won by Russian athletes in Pyeongchang to 14.

Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev congratulated the figure skaters on Twitter.
