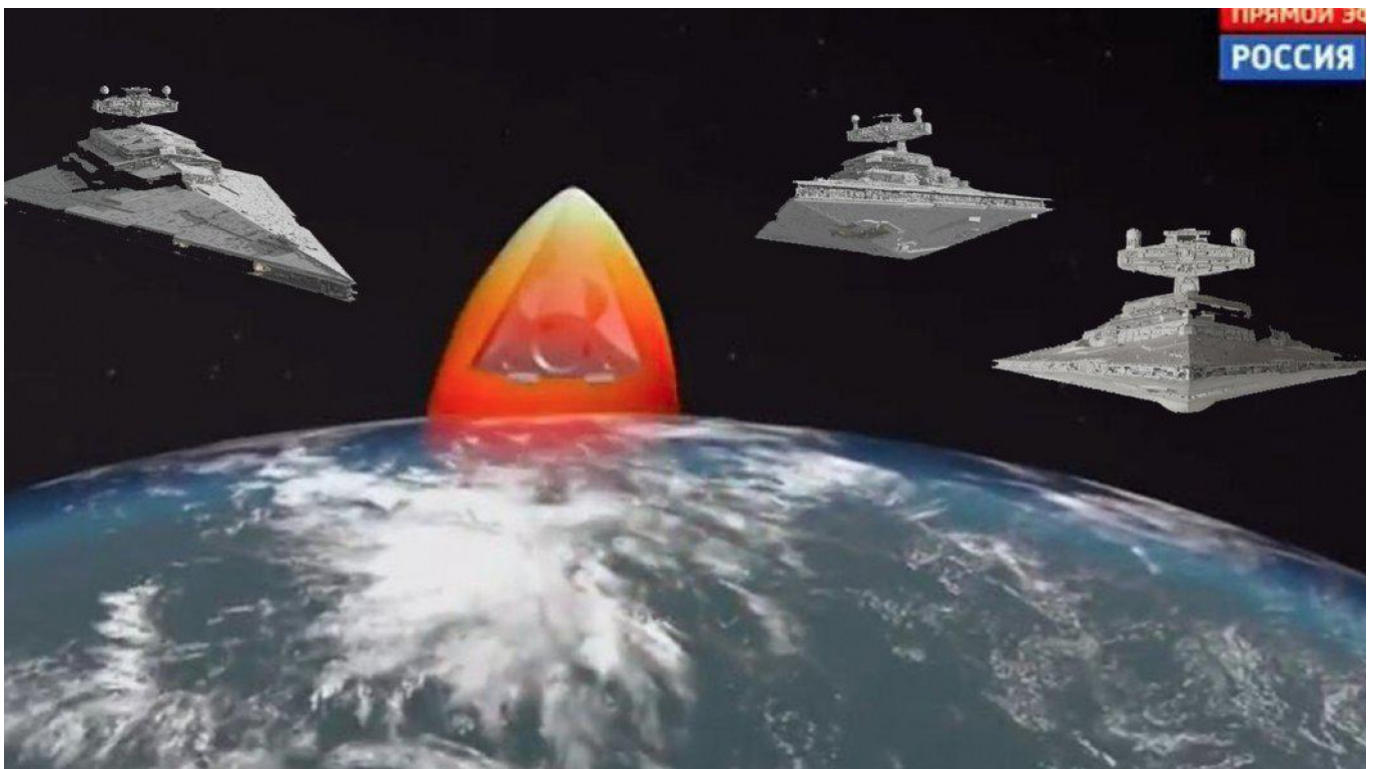


Putin's Nuclear Comments Launch Explosion in Russian Social Media

President Vladimir Putin delivered his annual address to Russian lawmakers on Thursday, spending much of his nearly two-hour long speech talking about Russia's military capabilities and [threats](#) of nuclear retaliation against the West.
