

Starbucks Opens First Russian Coffee Drive-Through Outside Moscow

Caffeine-starved drivers from a sleepy Moscow suburb will now have a chance to get their hot brew without stepping out of the car after Starbucks opened Russia's first drive-through coffee branch on Friday.

A decade after opening its first Russian branch in 2007, the American coffee chain is now ready to test the country's appreciation for the frappuccino on the road.

The drive-through was opened on the Krasnoarmeyskoye Highway in the city of Pushkin, the Vedomosti business daily [reported](#) Friday.

Dmitry, the first official customer at the branch, waited for over an hour to become the first person in Russia to get a cup of coffee without leaving his car.
