

Russian Orthodox Church Agrees With Pope: 'Sex Is a Gift From God'

A Russian Orthodox archbishop in charge of family affairs has sided with Pope Francis in his assessment that sexuality is not a taboo but a gift from God — as long as it is practiced within the family.

The pope reportedly <u>told</u> young worshippers in France this week that "passionate" love "leads you to give your life forever." "Sexuality, sex, is a gift of God. Not taboo," he was quoted as telling young Catholics from the Grenoble diocese.

Archpriest Dmitry Smirnov, who heads a Russian Orthodox patriarchal commission for children's and mother's rights, concurred with Pope Francis that "sex is a component of love."

"But only love within marriage," Smirnov <u>told</u> the Govorit Moskva radio station Wednesday.

He echoed the pope's message that premarital sex "violates God's plan and is a mortal sin."
