

United Russia Official Tabbed for Microchip Implant Experiment

The future is here, and it's less than 4,000 kilometers east of Moscow.

A Siberian ruling United Party official reportedly plans to volunteer for an experiment in which he will insert a microchip into his skin containing, among other information, his credit card.

The official, who is also a Tomsk State University vice rector for innovation, Konstantin Belyakov, will be one of 10 volunteers to have a 4mm by 1.5mm microchip implant sewn into their hands, the state-run TASS news agency <u>reported</u> Sunday.

"It functions as a bank card, an electronic key to access the university buildings and a 'Troika'

transport card, which is used in Moscow," the university's press service was <u>quoted</u> as saying.

The press service did not say when the experiment is scheduled to kick off.

The implant will <u>reportedly</u> be developed by a Moscow region-based chipmaker behind the Troika and the Mir bank cards.
