

Tourists Spent Record \$13.5Bln in Moscow Last Year – City Hall

Foreign tourists have spent a record 864 billion rubles (\$13.6 billion) in 2018 in Moscow, City Hall said Wednesday.

Some 5.5 million foreign tourists visited the Russian capital last year, according to the mayor's office. The influx placed Moscow in the top-20 list of the most visited European capitals last year, City Hall <u>said</u>.

Thanks to the increase, Moscow's budget revenues from tourism quadrupled from 2010 and totaled 118 billion rubles (\$1.8 billion) last year, deputy mayor Vladimir Yefimov <u>said</u> Wednesday.

A recent survey of international tourists has suggested that many are not traveling to Moscow

because they <u>think</u> it's too expensive and unsafe.

Meanwhile, the Boston Consulting Group <u>forecast</u> that Moscow could be among the world's fastest-growing tourist destinations by 2025 if its administration adopted a comprehensive strategy tailored toward improving potential visitors' experiences.

Officials say they <u>expect</u> 15 percent more tourists in 2019 due to the positive image created by the FIFA World Cup last summer.
