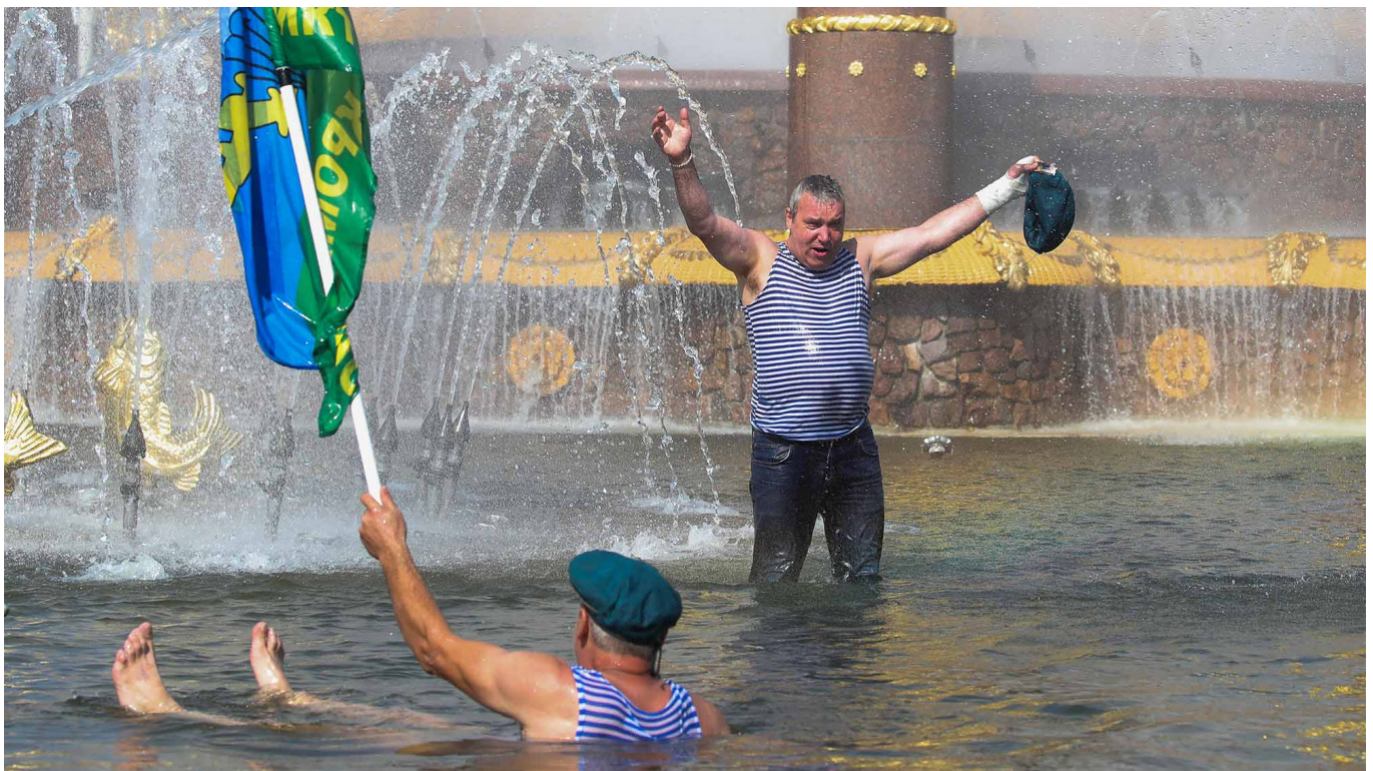


The Mischief and Mayhem of Russian Paratroopers' Day
