

Russia Finds Wiretaps in Foreign-Made Clothing Irons – Trade Official

Russian authorities have discovered pre-installed wiretap devices inside imported clothing irons, the Industry and Trade Ministry's top radioelectronics industry official <u>said</u> Wednesday.

Vasily Shpak warned that bugged appliances and electronic devices are a commonplace reality but did not specify the countries in which the irons were allegedly manufactured nor the potential motives for wiretapping.

"They are bugged. We have seen a couple of irons with [pre-installed] microphones. They look ordinary from the outside [...] but there must be a [transmitting] mechanism," the staterun TASS news agency quoted Shpak as saying at a press conference. Under a Russian law <u>adopted</u> in 2019, the distribution of devices that can transmit or store personal information without the owner's consent is punishable by up to four years in prison.

Shpak also <u>advised</u> iPhone users to avoid storing sensitive information on their devices.

"This [surveillance technology] is inherent for iPhones. While the [manufacturer's] intentions are good, the road to hell is paved with good intentions," Shpak said.
