

Director Kirill Serebrennikov Fired From Gogol Center

The fate of the theater's repertory and troupe are unknown.

The Moscow city department of culture [announced](#) on Feb. 3 that they would not be renewing Kirill Serebrennikov's contract as the director of the Gogol Center theater.

The previous day, on the theater's eighth "birthday," Serebrennikov had described some of the plans for 2021, which included not only theatrical productions but other artistic projects.

His contract will come to an end on Feb. 28.


Serebrennikov was appointed as director of the Gogol Theater in 2012. When he took the reins, the small theater was a moribund state-funded venue. In 2014 Serebrennikov reopened the theater as the Gogol Center, and the theater's innovative productions quickly brought the theater awards and accolades. It has continued to be one of the capital's most popular theaters.

In May 2017, the Center was raided by the Russian Investigative Committee, and Serebrennikov and three others were charged with embezzlement of state funds. The “theater trial” was largely perceived as political and ended with guilty charges and large fines, but probation rather than incarceration.

On Feb. 9 Serebrennikov shared the letter he received from the city announcing termination of his contract on Instagram and wrote, in part, "Everything in this world begins and then comes to an end. And then something new begins." He thanked his colleagues and ended with the words "And don't be depressed. There's no life or freedom in depression. You know what to do. Peace and love to all."
