

Police Launch Probe After Russian Lawmaker Attacked

Russian investigators <u>said</u> Friday that they have launched a criminal probe into "attempted murder" following an assault on a federal lawmaker.

Mikhail Matveyev, a Communist Party<u>member</u> of Russia's lower-house State Duma<u>, said</u> Thursday he had been<u>attacked</u> by "migrants" while attempting to stop them from harassing a passerby in the southern city of Samara.

"There's migrant mayhem on the streets," Matveyev, with his head bandaged, said in a video published on his personal Telegram channel.

Russia's Investigative Committee, which probes major crimes, initially<u>announced</u> a criminal probe on hooliganism charges. But on Friday, its chief Alexander Bastrykin<u>ordered</u> regional investigators to reclassify the attack as "attempted murder" due to the "circumstances of the incident and a public outcry."

Three people have been placed under arrest, the Investigative Committee said.

Matveyev, 56, published a series of videos in the aftermath of his attack, including a doctor <u>placing stitches</u> on his injured head.

He claimed the assailants were of Tajik, Uzbek and Russian ethnicity and had allegedly assaulted up to five people before he intervened.

Matveyev is known to have <u>co-authored</u> several bills aiming to curb migration in Russia.

Following Thursday's incident, the Investigative Committee<u>said</u> it has recommended that the Duma adopt new legislation that tightens control over undocumented migrants and naturalized citizens who commit crimes or evade military service.
