

Moscow Police Arrest U.S. Citizen for Allegedly Assaulting Officer

Law enforcement authorities in Moscow arrested a U.S. citizen for allegedly assaulting a police officer, state media <u>reported</u> Thursday, citing investigators.

The American, later identified as Joseph Tater, was approached by police on Monday night after he tried to check into a hotel without a Russian migration card — a document issued to foreign citizens when they enter the country.

"The suspect refused to provide identity documents, after which he used force against a law enforcement officer," an Investigative Committee spokeswoman was quoted as saying by the Interfax news agency.

Tater was said to have "hit a [police] employee on the forearm, pushed her," according to an unnamed source <u>quoted</u> by Interfax.

Police said the American was charged with assaulting an officer, a criminal offense that

carries a sentence of up to five years in prison if found guilty.

A Moscow court later on Thursday <u>ordered</u> Tater to be placed in pre-trial detention on administrative charges of hooliganism.

The U.S. Embassy in Moscow <u>told</u> the RTVI broadcaster that it was aware of the American's arrest but said it could not provide any further comments.
