

Dostoevsky's Only Great-Grandson Dmitry Dies at 79

Dmitry Dostoevsky, the only great-grandson of the Russian novelist and short-story writer Fyodor Dostoevsky, <u>passed away</u> on Wednesday at the age of 79.

Dmitry was the grandson of one of the famed novelist's four children, also named Fyodor Dostoevsky. Born in April 1945, he led a varied life, <u>working</u> as a diamond cutter, cab driver, electrician and tour guide.

He also appeared in two feature films and a documentary that followed his great-grandfather's journey through Western Europe. Before retiring, Dmitry operated a tram in St. Petersburg that passed by locations connected to the legendary author.

His death <u>was announced</u> Wednesday on his social media page and by the Dostoevsky Museum in St. Petersburg. The Telegram channel Shot, citing an interview with his son Alexei, <u>reported</u> that he died in his sleep from cardiac arrest after catching a cold.

Dmitry Dostoevsky is <u>survived</u> by his son and grandchildren.
