

Weeklong Snowstorm Buries Homes, Disrupts Services in Russia's Far East

A powerful snowstorm buried homes and disrupted essential services in Russia's Far East last week, regional media <u>reported</u> Monday, as local authorities prepared for another winter storm.

Heavy snowfall <u>began</u> last Tuesday, blanketing the Sakhalin region capital city of Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk, as well as surrounding towns and villages. Municipal crews <u>removed</u> at least 430,000 cubic meters (15,185,306 cubic feet) of snow, while local motorists blamed snow removal vehicles for worsening traffic congestion.

In the town of Sokol, north of Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk, a homeowner found his house completely <u>buried</u> under snow, while in a nearby multi-story residential building, snow sliding off the roof <u>shattered</u> the windows of a ground-floor apartment.

More than 50,000 students from nearly 100 schools in and around Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk switched to remote learning.

There were no reports of injuries or significant damage amid the heavy snowfall.

Emergency officials <u>issued</u> a new storm warning for Tuesday across the same southern districts hit by the previous snowstorm, urging residents and visitors to exercise caution.
